### Hammond Adv. Oct. 10, 1918

**Hammond:** "A number of cases of Spanish influenza have made their appearance here. The entire family of Pearl Finley is suffering from it." Mrs. Vincent Gallagher, Isla Gallagher, Dean DeLong also have influenza.

### Hammond Adv. Oct. 17, 1918

**South Hammond:** "Mrs. Catherine, Mrs. Solomon Leaf & son Howard have had the influenza and are improving. School is closed this week due to influenza." David Burns, Everett & Floyd Teall-under Dr's care for influenza.

**Hammond:** Leon Banford-influenza. "F D Harrington, manager of the T O Smith milk station, is in a very critical condition with influenza. On account of the many cases of epidemic influenza here there were no movies Saturday night and no church services Sunday."

**Black Lake:** "Harold Chester is home on the sick list from Watertown. Maud Mills went home to South Hammond with the influenza.

### **HAMMOND.**

**Hammond, Oct. 28.** The influenza is still raking in our town. The village school and most of the rural schools are still closed. Ensign Sitts is seriously ill of pneumonia. Charles Demick has been confined to his bed the past three weeks with neuritis. Mrs. Charles Demick had the misfortune to fall and break her ankle Sunday morning. Mrs. W. S. Cuthbert and Mrs. J. Rodger are in Ogdensburg caring for Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Cuthbert who have been sick. Mrs. Charles Davis left town this morning for her home in Denver after spending the past year with her mother. Mrs. William Demick of Ogdensburg has been spending a few days in town and returned home today accompanied by her mother, Mrs. Mary Smith, who will spend the winter with her. Dean DeLong, who recently entered the S. A. T. C. of Syracuse university, has been transferred to Camp Zachary Taylor, Kentucky. There will be a consignment sale of pure bred and grade Holsteins held at Gallagher's stables on Thursday, Nov. 7th. James Hunter has purchased from Alonzo Swayne the N. I. Young farm.
